Statistics show that 2% of reported missing kids are wearing I.D.

Different forms of child safety identification

High Schools provide some form of child safety identification through the use of I.D. cards. These I.D.'s provide your child's name and sometimes addresses.

For those of us who have children in grade school...names and addresses on our kids personal belongings such as bags and books may also provide identification.

What about during sports activities? What about when they're with friends? Sometimes our kids may become sick or injured while away from home.

Identification cards can be a way for others to know information about your child in case of these emergencies.
